reminder of the change in policy in the PHCC Challenge rules: # 14 - Games can be rated by the USCF, provided both players are members in good standing with the USCF and agree to have it rated by paying in advance to the TD (Lon Rutkofske, or other club official with a valid TD certification card.) of \$1.50@ to cover rating costs.] Updated Challenge rules will follow below:

Format and rules for PHCC Challenge System

I. Purpose: to provide club members the opportunity to challenge higher rated players on a regular basis to improve and test their skills in over the board non-tournament competition.

- II. Regulations: (Effective 11-8-2018)
 - a. Challenges may be made by any club member on the PHCC rating list under the following circumstances:
 - 1. Can only be made only by a lower rated player.
 - 2. Can only be made during club hours and cannot be made after 8:00PM.
 - 3. Must be played on the same day as the challenge was made, so there can be no advanced challenges.
 - 4. Both players must be present.
 - 5. Only one challenge may be made per meeting.
 - 6. Challenger can only challenge a player that is rated less than 400 points above him on the rating list.
 - 7. All challenges must be accepted.
 - 8. No challenge may be made while a participant is involved in a tournament or challenge game.
 - 9. A clock must be used with the time control of G/60 with 5 second delay; must be recorded by both players and submitted to the rating director upon completion of the game. (See Sample Score Sheet on page 2)
 - 10. All challenge games must comply with current tournament rules of chess as established by the US Chess Federation.
 - 11. No challenge game may be adjourned, but if an unusual circumstance arises, the club rating director may adjudicate.
 - 12. No member may be challenged more than one consecutive time by the same challenger. This means that the lower rated player cannot challenge the same player two times in a row. He/she must play another match before this can take place, but this also means that the higher rated player may be challenged by the same rated player consecutively if he has not participated in a match in between challenges within a six- week period. Abuse (I.E: Constant challenges and re-challenges or other annoying or inconsiderate behavior) must be reported to the Director and he has the option of suspending the violator indefinitely from participation in the Challenge system. Disputes will be adjudicated by the ratings director, with the advice of other players as he so wishes.
 - 13. Challenges can take place on the first Thursday of each month, or at any time there is no other tournament or event scheduled.
 - 14. **Games can be rated by the USCF**, provided both players are members in good standing with the USCF and agree to have it rated by paying in advance to the TD (Lon Rutkofske, or other club official with a valid TD certification card.) of \$1.50@ to cover rating costs.
 - 15. Results will be rated by the PHCC (*Using the USCF rating system.*) using current PHCC ratings posted at the club and will be adjusted as necessary by the club rating director. Changes will also be posted on the club website.

Club champion **Huso Avdic** managed to score 2.5/5 points at the 2022 MI Masters/Expert/Class tournament held in Lansing the weekend of January 8th and 9th. He remarked on his disappointment by saying: "I didn't have the stamina for the whole tournament, as it was very stressful and hard. I need experience for these two-day tournaments, but I enjoyed it and I hope next time to be better!" His games and the tournament cross table appear below. Chess Should Be Required in U.S. Schools

Perhaps chess should be introduced into the curriculum as a fun way to teach logic and memory? <u>Alex Berezow</u>

Rook to B8. Checkmate.

There's nothing quite like the feeling of defeating a worthy opponent in a game of chess: the ultimate battle of the wits. Of course, it's not a feeling I have very often, since I'm not very good at chess. On the other hand, my father is officially an "Expert" and my friend is a "Master." In other words, they are both very, very good. To give an idea of how good, if I was to play 100 games with each of them, I would win precisely zero.

Worldwide, chess is still a popular game, but it is treated with particular seriousness in eastern Europe. For instance, the Bulgarian National Olympic Committee has been lobbying for chess to be recognized as an Olympic sport, as has Kirsan Ilyumzhinov, the Russian president of the World Chess Federation. In September 2011, Armenia made chess a required subject for all children over the age of 6. (In the DW-TV news clip below, the children are in 2nd grade!)

Indeed, the Armenians may be on to something. One recent psychology study found that chess was associated with greater "cognitive abilities, coping and problem-solving capacity, and even socio-affective development of children." Of course, because it was a cohort (observational) study, the link could be due to some third factor or the possibility that smart, mature children are more inclined to play chess in the first place.

In the above video, the math/chess teacher says, "Chess trains logical thinking. It teaches how to make decisions, trains memory, strengthens will power, motivates children to win and teaches them how to deal with defeat. It's the only school subject that can do all this."

That is a very interesting insight. Not only does chess help train the brain, but it also teaches children basic life skills. In our culture, we hand out trophies to winners and losers — or neglect to keep score at all — out of some misguided, politically-correct notion that we should never hurt anyone's feelings. But, in Armenia, schools are teaching children reality: Sometimes you lose. That's an important lesson, and it should be taught at a young age.

What makes chess so fascinating is that no two games will ever play out the same. Checkers — really a game for intellectual wimps (like me) — has 500 billion billion possible positions, and in 2007, researchers reported that a computer has solved the game. (If neither side makes a mistake, the outcome is always a draw.) But chess is far more complicated than checkers. It is unlikely that a computer will ever "solve" the game.

Americans are concerned that our children aren't receiving a solid K-12 education. Perhaps chess should be introduced into the curriculum as a fun way to teach logic and memory? In fact, I should get back to practicing the game. Knowing that there are 7-year-old Armenians that could run me off the chessboard without breaking a sweat is a tad humiliating.


